NOTE:

The projects listed/mentioned are those the group Citizens for Conservation (CfC) Trinidad and Tobago are interested in and have been for quite some time. Mentioned are parks, squares, public and private buildings, estates, worship centres, tombs, monuments, markets, beaches and cultural sites most of which aren't well known by the general public. Some of the projects are 'dossiered' (put into historical document form for library and research usage); others aren't. Some are readily identified. Some are in a state of disrepair. Some will collapse if not attended to urgently.

As much as possible, CfC will dossier that which is to be dossiered and pictorially memorialize those which have no immediate drawing documentation for 2014 and beyond. Projects which require urgent attention (such as Mille Fleurs, President's House and Red House) and are ongoing shall continue as directed. Projects that require more information shall be researched more.

The list is not comprehensive. There are other buildings, squares, tombs, estates and other items which may or may not make the list but they exist somewhere documented in some form or another. Prime documentation lies with those (seniors, public officials working and retired, building owners and historians) who can surely and bravely say that their eyes have seen history for the longest while and know the story and/or legacy of each building or form established.
